AMOCA is asking for donations of handmade ceramic bowls, which will be sold (full of chili) during this special event. The proceeds will be applied to the museum's exhibition and events programming. Please help make this benefit event a success!

WHO: An invitation to participate is extended to all independent ceramic artists and to students at colleges, adult education programs, and community learning centers—anyone can help.

WHEN: The museum will begin taking donations of ceramic bowls today!

WHERE: Please drop off bowls at the museum anytime during our open museum hours. Wednesday - Saturday from 12pm to 5pm, or call us at 909.865.3146 to arrange a time during office hours.

WHAT: All ceramic handmade bowls must be glazed on the inside and lip, must be microwave and food safe and should not possess rough or dangerous edges. Bowl diameter should be no larger than 12 inches. Each bowl will be sold at \$12.

WHY: As a non-profit organization, AMOCA relies on donations to sustain its unique, ceramics-only venue. Your contributions provide grassroots support for educational exhibitions, related workshops, lectures, and films. Advertise your work to the public - tape a business card to your bowl to get the word out about your artistry.

This is also an opportunity for students to earn community service credits. For more information, check with your ceramic instructor.
